#### A LIGHT HEARTED REVIEW OF A VERY UNUSUAL SHOP

As some of you know I often go to the Isle of Wight and if you ever find yourself visiting the island there is a shop in Ryde which is well worth a visit - you may or may not wish to buy something but it is worth going just for a look - one of the strangest shops I have ever been in!

It is called "The Mad Haberdasher" and despite having visited the town many times I have only just realised what it is, as from the outside it looked like a sort of "hippie shop" with flags, bags and goodness knows what on display outside. However, it really is a haberdashers but stocks the most bizarre things, including regular fabric, haberdashery, and wool patterns, but also dinky cars (yes - really!) and various collectibles. (even a box of Commando magazines which I haven't seen for years!)

It is so stuffed to the rafters that there is only room to shuffle round in single file. I took a couple of pictures last week to give you some idea and whilst you might not be in the market for anything if you travel to the Island it is definitely worth going to if only to marvel at such an out of the world place. Saying that - it is also possible that you can get something that you have been trying to find for ages - quite honestly I've never seen so many types of elastic in one place.....

PS for anyone visiting the island who suddenly needs more regular fabric shops (always a risk of needing a fabric fix!) there is a proper quilting shop in Ryde - The stitching Elmers - and a cheaper fabric shop in Newport called Hellerslea Fabrics which again stocks all sorts of things - just not so haphazardly as the Mad Haberdasher!!
